o Janitor update- there has been some interviews for the janitor position.

Property

- Waxing the daycare floor still needs to be done.- In contract to be done 2x/year
- O Daycare fence update- the west side of the fence has been replaced. But more needs to be done to meet licensing guidelines- will be getting new quote. 9/12 update-quote from Forward Fence received at \$1,078.30. This includes replacement of the section on the southwest corner, replacement of the two sections east of the gate, adding a lower rail to the backside of the toddler fence, repairing the hole on the westside (new fence) that happened during installation and fixing the sharp chain link ties. The bid was approved on 9/12 by email. The plan is to replace the remainder of the fence in the spring.
- Flooring in two of daycare rooms downstairs needs to be replaced. Will replace on weekend of September 21st. Cost of about \$1600. Will also fix railing and install TV in family room.
- Carpet in the upstairs daycare/Sunday School room needs to be replaced. Stacey
 would prefer NOT with more carpet and as soon as possible. In the meantime, brown
 duct tape over the damaged areas may suffice for upcoming inspection and known
 plan in place.
- O Justin will check Handicapped entrance-buttons. They don't function to open the doors. He has not had an opportunity to evaluate.
- Window in upper east side room has been left open on more than one occasion by daycare. Window is difficult to close (hardware is old and bent). Winter is comingnot an issue now and it has not been observed left open lately.

• Handrail on stairway near handicapped entrance is coming off of wall and sheetrock is damaged. On the agenda to be fixed September 21 weekend.

• Financially Salem is holding steady as far as numbers go and doing better than this time last year.
