Greetings Everyone,

Hopefully, we are all enjoying the wonderful weather we've had so far this spring. I also hope such good weather will continue on June 21, when I run the half marathon during Grandma's Marathon weekend. One part of running that I enjoy is the ability to reflect and let my mind wander on various topics. Of course, some of the topics I think about include faith and ministry activities. Running can be equated to our practice of faith in daily life. Both require a sense of commitment, reflection, discernment, and even a bit of endurance through the rougher times. Overall, being a running pastor might be a good thing—not just for my physical health, but also for my spiritual health as well.

In scripture, we hear some authors use running or racing as a metaphor for faith. One passage I enjoy is found in 2 Timothy 4:7: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." (NRSV) Often, this passage is read at funerals, as it reflects on the overall summary of life and faith. Paul was specifically describing his own life and faith experiences as he felt his life was nearing an end. In this piece, he equates finishing a race with keeping the faith. When I hear these two together, I am reminded of the strength and endurance that both running, and faith have in common. However, I am also reminded of the joy and excitement that can come with finishing a race and being active in faith. Overall, I find running and faith to be a good pair when it comes to our life's journey.

Granted, we all may not be runners, but I would encourage everyone to think about how faith is a part of your lives. I would imagine that at times there have been struggles, pains, and exhaustion. I would also imagine there have been great joys and wondrous strides that have kept you going. Overall, both faith and life journeys are complicated and filled with many emotions. Yet to keep up with faith can bring forth great joy and love that outweighs everything else. This is a similar feeling to the one you experience when crossing the finish line after a long race. That's probably why Paul related finishing a race to keeping the faith in 2 Timothy. Even though many may not be physically able to run, I hope everyone continues to keep faith just as I keep running the races I sign up for. May God's blessings be with you this and every month. Amen.
