Greetings Everyone,

As we wind down the fall season and move into winter, many of you have likely been preparing your homes for the cold and snow ahead. One of the preparations I do for my own home is to put plastic on some of my older windows. I also switch out the screen panels for glass ones and, of course, make sure the furnace is in good working order with a fresh filter. These are just a few of the small projects that help get my home ready for winter.

Another kind of preparation we begin at the end of November and carry through most of December is Advent, a time to center our lives as we wait in anticipation to celebrate the coming of the Christ child into the world. Some of you may have already skipped over the waiting part of Advent and put up all your Christmas decorations! But even so, we still must wait for Christmas to arrive. We can't simply make Christmas by our own effort; it must come to us. The whole point of Christmas is that God, in Christ, comes to us in our world, not because of anything we do, but as a gift of grace.

While we wait for Christmas, there are plenty of things we think have to be done. Often, our waiting and to do's are buying gifts, grocery shopping, attending school concerts, or going to holiday parties. Yet Christmas is about the coming of Christ our Lord into a broken and chaotic world that so desperately needs the Christ child to save it from itself—a child who shows us how to have faith in God and care for the world around us.

In Matthew's Gospel, which we'll hear during Advent, John the Baptist calls out, "Prepare the way of the Lord." How might we prepare during this Advent season? Perhaps by reflecting on Scripture, spending time in prayer, or helping a neighbor with their own winter preparations. Let us not be consumed by what we think we must do. However, instead focus on what we get to do, we get to connect with God, we get to strengthen our relationships with one another, and we get to engage with our community in faith. Our preparation for the coming of the Lord may not look like the usual Christmas chaos, but rather, it can be found in moments of connection, reflection, and service.

No matter how you spend these next few weeks of Advent and Christmas, I hope it is a joyous time. A time and season filled with patient waiting, meaningful preparation, and healthy connections. Whatever this month brings, may it also be a blessing from God to you all. Amen.
