Greetings everyone, and Happy New Year, Hopefully, everyone has had a wonderful holiday season and is ready to begin a new year. I am excited to see what new things may come in the year ahead. On a synod level, we will be holding a bishops' election, along with welcoming a new bishop to lead our synod. At Salem, we continue to explore and support new ways we can be community together. With all this newness, and really with all new things, we look to faith to help guide us.

Of course, our greatest guiding principle in faith is God. God, who, as Revelation reminds us, is the "Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end," and "the one who makes all things new" (Revelation 21:5–6, NRSV). God accomplishes this work through the persons of the Holy Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We are often reminded of God's creative, fatherly aspects when we talk about our environment. We also frequently speak of God the Son, whom we experience in Christ and all that comes with him. However, the Spirit of God is very diverse

and, at times, is not spoken about as much. For the purpose of this article, I want to focus on the Holy Spirit. I do so because of how important the role of the Spirit is when we face things that are new or different. A major aspect of the Holy Spirit is its guiding presence, empowering us to go well beyond what we could ever imagine. The Spirit is also the connecting and grounding force within us, drawing us together in faith. In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you" (John 14:16–17, NRSV). Christ tells us that this invisible presence is always with us, aiding us in our daily lives, an advocate who remains, guides, and keeps us connected to our faith as we live in the world.

As we begin this new year with all things made new, there will be many experiences we will face. Whether these new things are positive or challenging, we face them with the fullness of God. A fullness expressed in the triune nature of God's three persons. Especially supported through God's Spirit, who is a constant presence in our daily lives and in whatever newness comes our way. May God's blessing be with us as we begin this new year. Amen.

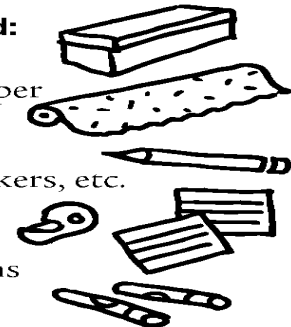

PRAYER BOX

Family prayer time is a good habit. Make it fun with this activity for all family members. They can use this special box whenever they have a prayer request.

What you need:

- Shoebox
- Wrapping paper
- Scissors
- Tape
- Stickers, markers, etc. (optional)
- Index cards
- Pencils or pens



What you do:

1. Wrap the shoebox like a present. Be sure to wrap the lid separately so it can be removed.
2. Let the whole family help decorate the box. You can write Bible verses about prayer, draw pictures, glue on pictures or add stickers. Be creative!
3. Put the box in a prominent location of your house. Keep a pile of index cards and pencils or pens near the box.
4. Whenever a family member has a prayer request, he or she can write or draw it on a card and put it inside the box.
5. Family members can share the cards in a prayer circle, or people can take turns praying for all the requests. Throughout the week, family members can check the box for new prayer needs.
